### We feel at home everywhere in the country, Petersen says

Goalkeeper disputes travelling for host games adds to Chiefs' bad form

Kaizer Chiefs goalkeeper Brandon Petersen has downplayed the impact playing their home games in Durban and Polokwane is having on their bad form, saying it does not make any difference as they always feel at home everywhere in the country.

Chiefs have played only two of their six home league fixtures in their original and primary backyard, the FNB Stadium, taking two apiece to the Moses Mabhida and Peter Mokaba stadiums.

Some feel this rather nomadic act is divesting them of stability at a time when consistency continues to elude them.

However, Petersen is adamant that their struggles have nothing to do with not playing at one fixed home venue, reasoning they have won games at the Peter Mokaba and Moses Mabhida stadiums this season, attracting good crowds too.

"I think we're just going through a bit of a rough patch and it has nothing to do with where we play our home matches," Petersen said at the Nedbank Cup draw last week.

"It doesn't make any difference where we play because we

always feel at home everywhere in the country.

"We've already won games in Durban and Polokwane this season, so you can't say it unsettles us to play there.

"Yes, there's a bit of travelling but it's not something that you can complain about when you know you also have fans in these cities.

"Maybe the argument would've been solid had we not won games at the Moses Mabhida and Peter Mokaba stadiums."

In September, City Press reported that the Polokwane local municipality paid Ama-khosi R1.5m a season for hosting three matches at the Peter Mokaba Stadium, adding the

municipality took 80% of the gate takings with Chiefs only pocketing 20% after the two parties signed a three-year deal in 2023.

Amakhosi also have a deal with the eThekweni metro to play three league games at the Moses Mabhida Stadium.

It is unclear how much the deal is worth.

Moses Mabhida Stadium manager Vusi Mazibuko could not be reached for comment yesterday.

Chiefs will play their last Betway Premiership home game at the Moses Mabhida Stadium against Sekhukhune United on Sunday (3.30pm).

Amakhosi's last league home game at Peter Mokaba is against TS Galaxy on April 5.

### Everton boss Moyes confident he can replicate past success

Everton manager David Moyes says he is confident in his ability to lead the Merseyside club to better days again, almost 12 years after his first spell in charge during which they had their only top-four finish of the last 37 years.

Moyes spent 11 years at Goodison Park before moving to Manchester United in 2013.

The 61-year-old Scot replaces Sean Dyche, who was sacked on Thursday hours before Everton beat third-tier Peterborough 2-0 in the FA Cup third round.

The Toffees, who stand 16th in the Premier League, host Aston Villa today, having won one of their last 11 league games and only three all season, leaving them a point above the relegation zone and prompting Dyche's exit.

Everton, under new American owners the Friedkin Group, have tasked Moyes with guiding the club through their next chapter, which includes avoiding the drop and overseeing the move to the new Bramley-Moore Dock stadium next season.

"I've had other opportuni-

ties, quite a few since leaving West Ham United and I didn't feel ready," Moyes, who left the London club by mutual consent at the end of last season, told reporters.

"But I always felt if this job came up — and I didn't expect it to — when I got asked it was too big of an opportunity to turn down.

"I want to show I can go again. I have got to try to prove myself again."

Everton had nine top-eight finishes under Moyes, who led them to the 2009 FA Cup final — their only showpiece match of the past 30 years, plus the Champions League qualifying rounds in 2005.

Additionally, the Scot helped secure European qualification four times in 11 years, a feat the club has managed only twice in the 12 years since.

However, Moyes pointed out that Everton are quite different from the side he inherited in March 2002.

"This is a different beast from many other clubs," he said when asked about his statement two weeks ago that he did not want to return to management for a relegation battle.

"A few weeks ago I thought there was no chance Everton would be in a relegation fight and I think they will be strong enough to stay away from it. "We need everyone behind

us, the players playing better and scoring more goals if we're going to make that happen ... I'm not coming back to the same Everton.

"I don't think Everton are getting the same David Moyes."

The Scot added that he was much wiser now with some 1,000 games in the Premier League under his belt.

"I'm going to try to play as many games as you can, then I'll start thinking about style of play. Goodison will help," he said.

Everton were docked points last season for breaching the Premier League's profit & sustainability rules.

Asked about the club's plans for the January transfer window, Moyes said: "There's a [new] stadium and it looks the business. It looks elite so we need to get some elite players.

"Absolutely, if I can give the supporters something to shout about by bringing in new players. We need to get together and find a way of spending a bit of money.

"We need to be mindful, we need to clear a bit too." — Reuters

### Success in African soccer a plus for SA, Pirates coach Riveiro says

Orlando Pirates coach Jose Riveiro has suggested that the progression of the Buccaneers and Stellenbosch to quarter-finals of the Caf Champions League and Confederation Cup respectively will strengthen Bafana Bafana.

Pirates beat Algerian side CR Belouizdad 2-1 in their penultimate group C fixture at Orlando Stadium over the weekend to qualify for the last eight with a game to spare, while to secure their berth in the last eight, Stellies won 2-0 against Stade Malien of Mali in their penulti-

mate Confed Cup group B fixture at Loftus Versfeld Stadium. "Congratulations to Stellenbosch as well [for qualifying for the Confederation Cup quarter-finals]. I think it's good news for SA football," Riveiro said.

"My way of thinking is that national teams are a reflection of your own football.

"When the national team is doing well, like Bafana now, it's because there's something good happening in our football.

"Hopefully all of us can do a good job in continental competitions this season because it's good for everyone."

Relebohile Mofokeng and

Thalente Mbatha netted the goals that sent Bucs to the top of group C ahead of their final fixture away to Al Ahly in Cairo on Saturday.

Riveiro made it clear they wanted to win against Al Ahly to maintain their top spot in group C, also highlighting they wanted to "show a good picture" of Pirates in Cairo.

"The way that we did it [qualifying for the quarter-finals] is something we must be proud of," he said.

"We still have to play in Cairo one more game. We want to show a good picture of ourselves in that game even

though we're already in quarter-finals.

"It's an opportunity to be top of the table at the end of the group stages and that's the only thing in our minds."

"We want to go to Cairo and perform while still playing our best football. Having the opportunity to play against these teams is a luxury for us as a group because it pushes us to the limits.

"The background these games are going to leave in our players is something that you can't buy, so we want to enjoy until the last minute of the competition." — SoutetanLIVE
