Goalkeeper disputes travelling for host games adds to Chiefs' bad form

Kaizer Chiefs goalkeeper Brandon Petersen has downplayed the impact playing their home games in Durban and Polokwane is having on their bad form, saying it does not make any difference as they always feel at home everywhere in the country.

Chiefs have played only two of their six home league fixtures in their original and primary backyard, the FNB Stadium, taking two apiece to the Moses Mabhida and Peter Mokaba stadiums.

Some feel this rather nomadic act is divesting them of stability at a time when consistency continues to elude them. However, Petersen is adamant that their struggles have nothing to do with not playing at one fixed home venue, reasoning they have won games at the Peter Mokaba and Moses Mabhida stadi-



Everton manager David Moyes says he is confident in his ability to lead the Merseyside club to better days again, almost 12 years after his first spell in charge during which they had their only top-four finish of the last 37 years.

Moyes spent 11 years at Goodison Park before moving to Manchester United in 2013. The 61-year-old Scot re-

in the Premier League, host Aston Villa today, having won one of their last 11 league games and only three all season, leaving them a point above the relegation zone and prompting Dyche's exit. Everton, under new Ameri-
