1. Project Description

Winnie Madikizela Mandela Local Municipality hereby invites qualified and experienced service providers for the supply, Installation and maintenance of VoIP telephone system for the period of three years (36 Months).

WMMLM is currently using 3CX telephone solution and has three (3) sites namely: Main office and 2 remote sites (DLTC and Civic Centre). There is an existing infrastructure in all 3 sites which includes telephone and LAN.
